To the thirsty God will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life. (Rev. 21:6) Come, Lord Jesus. (Rev. 22:20)


Jesus Christ is the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end. (Rev. 22:13) Come. Lord Jesus.

The reading appointed for the day is followed by a sermon or another form of reflection.

HYMN or CANTICLE

The assembly stands.

PRAYERS

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

The prayers begin with the prayer of the day for the previous Sunday in Advent. Other prayers of thanksgiving for the gifts of God and intercession for others and ourselves may follow.

The prayers conclude with the following prayer.
