The psalmody begins with a morning psalm of praise: Psalm 95:1-7a (the Venite), Psalm 63:1-8, Psalm 67, Psalm 100, or another appropriate psalm. The psalm may be preceded and followed by a general or seasonal invitatory. See your Leaders' Guide.

## **PSALM:**

The Psalm appointed for the day is sung or spoken, done in a variety of ways. It concludes with a time of silence and the **psalm prayer**. The psalm prayer may be found after the psalm in the ELW LDE, beginning on p.737.
