INVITATION

The peace of Christ be with you **And also with you.**

Into our darkness, doubt and despair, Come, Christ Jesus, be our light.

Into our sorrow, sickness, and grief, Come, Christ Jesus, be our comfort.

Into each conflict, division, and war, Come, Christ Jesus, be our peace.

Into this wounded world, Come, Christ Jesus, be our hope.

When we call to you, hear our cry. Do no abandon us, but draw near. Come, Christ Jesus, be our life.

When we call to you, hear our cry. Do not abandon us, but draw near. Come, Christ Jesus, be our life. Amen.

SONG

An alleluia, a morning hymn, or a seasonal hymn appropriate to the time of day is sung.

PRAYER

Let us pray:

God of glory, fill your church with the power that flows from Christ's resurrection, that, in the midst of the sinful world, it may signal the beginning of a renewed humanity, risen to new life with Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. AMEN

PSALM:

Introduce the Psalm and explain how it will be read or sung. Feel free to copy and paste the psalm into this form for sake of ease:

PSALM PRAYER:

The Psalm Prayer can be found in the ELW Leaders' Desk Edition or on the Student Drive under the folder Chapel and then under Worship Resources. Each Psalm has a particular prayer printed at the end of it.

SCRIPTURE

Before the reading, announce:

A reading from <Book>.

After the reading, say:

Word of God, word of life.

The assembly stands.

HYMN or CANTICLE

A hymn related to the scripture reading or a seasonal hymn. Possible canticles include: Song of Zechariah (*ELW #226*, *250*, *552*), Salvation belongs to our God (*ELW* p. 219)

PRAYERS AROUND THE CROSS

When the music begins, you are invited to come to the cross to kneel, sit or stand to pray. Come alone or with another. Stay as long as you would like. If you pray at the station with the square vessel, others may come and lay hands upon you while you pray, joining their prayers with yours. Light a candle as a sign of hope, lit in the hope of Christ's cross and resurrection, dancing amidst darkness. Let us

gather around the cross as the body of Christ, renewed and given life through Christ's cross and resurrection.

Choose several shorter, contemplative-style hymns for singing during the prayers. Hymns may be chosen from ELW, Singing Our Prayer, or another resource (provided copies can be distributed before the service).
