Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

MORNING HYMN

An alleluia, a morning hymn, or a seasonal hymn appropriate to the time of day is sung.

PSALM - <Name>

HYMN or CANTICLE

The assembly stands to sing.

Keep in Mind (*LBW*, p. 457)

Salvation belongs to our God (*WOV* p. 47)
