
If you have a commemoration or particular instructions about a portion of the service, put them here.

After the Litany for the Healing of the Nations, there will be a time for prayer. You may light a candle and place it in any of the stations, or just pray as you wish. If you pray at the station with the square vessel, others may come and lay hands upon you while you pray, joining their prayers with yours.

PSALM: <Psalm (and verses, if necessary)> - <<u>Name</u>>

After the Psalm is finished, allow 10-15 seconds of silence.

PSALM PRAYER: - <<u>Name</u>>

BRIEF TIME FOR SILENCE (15-30 seconds)

PRAYER FOR THE HEALING OF THE NATIONS - <*Name*>

The Litany of the Nations begins the time for prayer. Cantor sings the refrain first, then everyone sings. **For the healing of nations we pray to you O God.** The cantor sings the stanzas and after each pairing of countries, the assembly sings **Peace be yours**. After each stanza, everyone responds with the refrain.

HYMNS:

Choose several shorter, contemplative-style hymns for singing during the prayers. Hymns may be chosen from ELW, Singing Our Prayer, or another resource (provided that copies can be distributed before the service).
